ADMISSION AND USEFUL INFORMATION

APPLICATION CHECKLIST – BACHELOR'S DEGREE AND STUDY ABROAD STUDENTS

- Complete Application for Admission.
- Complete Supplemental Application for International Students.
- Submit original or certified copies of the original and official academic record, transcript or examination results for the completion of secondary education. Official documents not issued in English must be accompanied by a certified English translation.
- Submit an official result of the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or International English Language Test System (IELTS). TOEFL score of 90 on the IBT, 550 on the PBT, 213 on the CBT and 6.5 on the IELTS or higher is required for applicants if the language of instruction is not English.
- The SAT is NOT required.
- Writing sample or essay (waived for visiting students)
- Rolling admission deadline

APPLICATION CHECKLIST – GRADUATE STUDENTS

- Complete graduate application.
- Complete Supplemental Application for International Students.
- Possess an earned bachelor's degree from an accredited institution. Official transcripts must be submitted from each institution attended. Any official documents not issued in English must be accompanied by a certified English translation.
- Three letters of recommendation
- Personal statement of 500 words or less describing the applicant's experience and why he or she wishes to pursue this degree
- TOEFL score of 90 on the IBT, 550 on the PBT, 213 on the CBT and 6.5 on the IELTS or higher is required for applicants
- Any additional program specific requirements
- Fall deadline: July 1; Spring deadline: Nov. 1

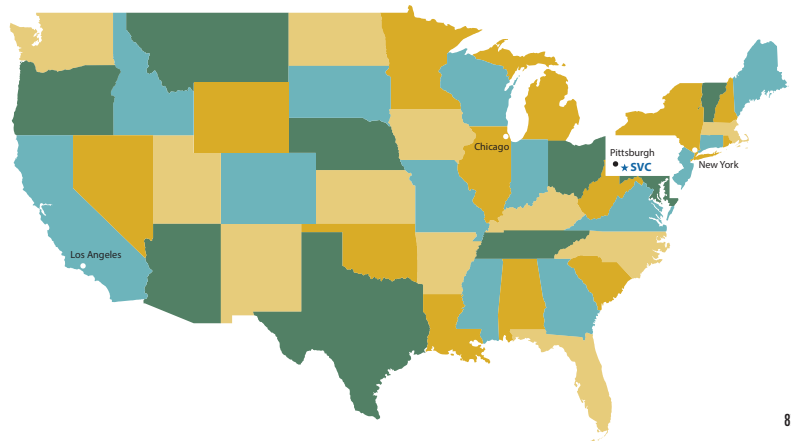
HOUSING INFORMATION
